Integrity House seeks a Medical Director to provide leadership for its statewide efforts in battling the opioid crisis in New Jersey.

Rebuilding lives for more than 50 years, Integrity House is at the forefront of New Jersey's efforts combat the opioid crisis, a role it assumed when former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie declared an opioid epidemic in the state. Integrity House has been recognized nationally for its work as well.



Since 1968, the organization has helped tens of thousands of men,

women and adolescents rebuild their lives from the disease of addiction. One of the largest non-profit providers of substance use disorder treatment, Integrity House is committed to helping individuals and families through comprehensive, integrated addictions treatment and recovery support in a manner that brings about positive, long-term lifestyle change. Integrity House is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) and licensed by the New Jersey Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services. Integrity House provides outpatient, residential and supportive housing programs coupled with support services make long-term recovery possible for our clients.

Integrity House is a mission-based organization that responds to the immediate needs of the community. The organization delivers top-notch, evidenced-based, effective care. Legislators, funding agencies, donors, and community leaders are drawn to our organization because of its incredible reputation as an anchor institution. Integrity House supports community initiatives, partners with other organizations, advocates on behalf of its clients and the community, and responds to critical needs. Integrity House is a sought-after participant in presentations, panels, and high-level discussions regarding substance use disorder.

Integrity House seeks a dynamic and compassionate Medical Director to provide leadership for its addiction medicine and primary care services. The Medical Director holds a key position at the organization and is an integral positive force our clients' recovery.

History and Impact



In the mid-60's, David Kerr, a Newark parole officer, recognized the need for recovery resources for the parolees on his caseload. Enlisting the aid of his colleague Richard Grossklaus, the two built Kerr's original Integrity House. Today, Integrity House serves clients from all of New Jersey's 21 counties, and has locations in Newark, Secaucus, Jersey City, Toms River, Morris Plains, Kearny, and Paramus.

Under the leadership of President & Chief Executive Officer Robert J. Budsock, the organization has seen dramatic growth and expanded ability to provide recovery services throughout New Jersey. Since January 2017, when former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie declared an opioid epidemic in New Jersey, Integrity House has helped more than 7,000 people through a broad range of substance use disorder treatment services.



In response to community needs, Integrity House began providing outpatient services in Ocean County. In 2017, Integrity House

earned competitive funding from the New Jersey Division of Mental Health Services to launch the Ocean County Support Team for Addiction Recovery (STAR) Program. STAR has earned U.S. Department of Health & Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) funding as well. In that same year, Integrity House became the thirdparty operator of addiction treatment services at Bergen New Bridge Medical Center, New Jersey's largest hospital. Additional recent accomplishments are listed at the end of this profile.

With an annual budget that now exceeds \$20 million, Integrity House serves 3,000 men and women each year. For nearly two decades, it has been one of the few residential providers to have an accredited opioid pharmacotherapy (OTP) treatment program in the State of New Jersey. A holistic approach to substance use disorder treatment that includes a full continuum of care integrated with mental health services, healthcare services, and educational and employment readiness services results in excellent client outcomes:

The organization's values of integrity, commitment, teamwork, excellence, and compassion are demonstrated at every level. Integrity House prides itself on its longevity and on the quality and commitment of its leadership and staff. Mr. Budsock has been with the organization for more than 30 of the organization's 50 years, as has many members of the staff.

Programs

Integrity House provides a full continuum of care that encompasses:

- Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient Services (ASAM Level of Care 3.7)
- Clinically Managed High Intensity Residential Services (ASAM Level of Care 3.5)
- Clinically Managed Low Intensity Residential Services (ASAM Level of Care 3.1)
- Partial Hospitalization (ASAM Level of Care 2.5)
- Intensive Outpatient Services (ASAM Level of Care 2.1)
- Outpatient Services (ASAM Level of Care 1.0)

Through its partnership with Bergen New Bridge Medical Center, Integrity House offers Medically Managed Intensive Inpatient Services (ASAM Level of Care 4.0) and Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient Services (ASAM Level of Care 3.7). As a third-party provider, Integrity House professionals serve as experts in substance use treatment, providing guidance to the medical staff from a behavioral health perspective.

Integrity House is committed to building a talented staff. A group of physicians and Advanced Practice Nurses (APNs) provides medical and psychiatric services. The staff also includes behavioral health professionals who are licensed in various disciplines (social workers, professional counselors, marriage and family therapists, etc.) as well as staff with lived experience. Behavioral health specialists on staff are equipped to deal with a number of special populations, including trauma (through eye movement desensitization and reprocessing, or EMDR) and gender nonconforming clients.

The structure of the medical departments affords great flexibility to the incoming Medical Director. Each site has a lead nurse (with many years of experience at Integrity House and in the SUD field). The nurses triage the clients and sick calls, and are able to address most issues, thus avoiding after-hours calls for the physicians. The team also includes a group of Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) and Certified Medical Assistants (CMAs).

Looking to the Future

The Integrity House 2018-2020 Strategic Plan is a roadmap for success. The plan, consistent with the organization's values of integrity, commitment, compassion, excellence and teamwork, prioritizes three goals:

- Expanding the use of medication-assisted treatment (MAT). Integrity House provides an array of treatment including Methadone, Buprenorphine, and Naltrexone, as well as nicotine replacement therapy (NRT).
- Preserving the therapeutic community model
- Enhancing quality improvement initiatives

Integrity House remains committed to its foundational model of a therapeutic community as well and has integrated all new and modern therapies into its model to better meet the needs of our clients. The therapeutic model varies by level of care to provide individualized care, in the best needs of clients at every level of care.

Integrated care initiatives such as the Integrity Care wellness program reflect the organization's commitment to holistic, integrated care. The organization is currently pursuing the establishment of an on-site primary care clinic for its clients as well as the local community.

The Role of the Medical Director

The Medical Director role at Integrity House offers an opportunity to expand the organization's medical perspective regarding the treatment of substance use disorder. This will be a challenging but highly rewarding position. The Medical Director will be part of a dedicated team that is committed to advancements in treatment that hold promise for our clients.

The Medical Director will provide oversight, direction and provision of quality medical services by overseeing operations for client care provided by the Medical Services Department. Additional responsibilities include:

- Ensure that medical services are coordinated and integrated with behavioral care
- Build a positive, team-oriented culture that inspires medical staff and behavioral counseling staff to work in concert to benefit the client
- Establish measurable performance expectations (productivity, quality of care, timely completion of medical records and client care, charting and other administrative duties, etc.), provide supervision, coaching, and disciplining Medical Department staff
- Ensure that facilities meet required medical staffing patterns
- Review credentials and participate in hiring medical staff
- Develop policies and procedures for Medical Services Department and ensure staff are trained and follow them
- Review of physical examination reports and medical screenings to ensure that client's medical needs are addressed in their treatment plan
- Supervision of the facility's physician(s) and advance practice nurses
- Ordering, interpreting and documenting medical and drug screening tests as appropriate
- Documenting orders for medical services for clients: including frequency and type of treatment, therapies to be administered and medications prescribed
- Ensure medical follow-up of all acute or chronic illness and conditions

This position offers a flexible schedule. Candidate must be willing to travel between the organization's Newark and Secaucus facilities, and be available on-call if necessary.

Candidate Qualifications and Experience

The ideal candidate will possess an MD degree and licensure to practice in the State of New Jersey. S/he must be must be ASAM Certified and will have demonstrated skills and experience in the substance use field.
