

Scott Kobler has been a partner at McCarter & English, LLP since 1989 and for many years was a member of its Executive Committee. As a community and philanthropic leader, Scott is involved in numerous arts and social justice organizations. For over 30 years, Scott has served on the boards operating New Jersey's public television system, and is currently chair of Public Media New Jersey (NJ PBS), an affiliate of WNET/Channel 13. He is a director of the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, a member of the Newark Alliance, and a director of the Catholic Medical Mission Board (CMMB), an international, faith-based NGO providing long-term, co-operative, medical, and development aid to communities affected by poverty and unequal access to healthcare.
